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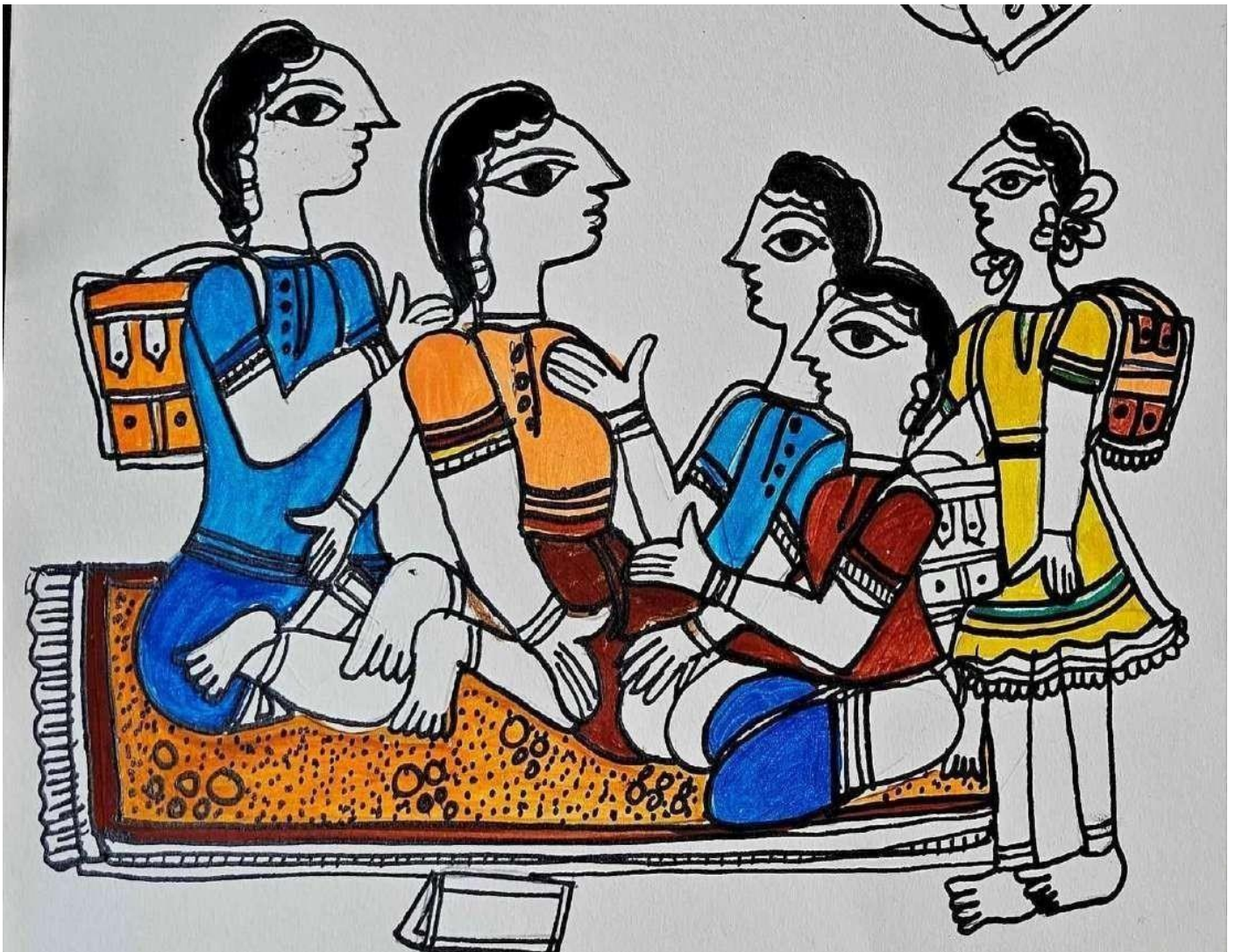

## 2. Organizational Background

### 2.1 Introduction

Aasaman Nepal (ASN) is one of the leading Terai based NGOs led and managed by social activists since its establishment in Dhanusha, Janakpur in 1999. It was registered (R. No: 693/055/56) in the District Administration Office and has been affiliated with the Social Welfare Council (M. No: 10362), along with the Inland Revenue Office Kathmandu (PAN No: 301419332). ASN has been engaged in developing and implementing programs aimed at protection, promotion, and fulfillment of child rights in Nepal. Currently it is working in 24 projects covering 23 districts of Nepal, along with its close collaboration with local institution and authorities, in partnership with development partners like Voluntary Service Overseas (VSO), Global Development Group, BMZ/Welthungerhilfe (WHH), Swiss Contact, Population Service International (PSI), Street Child, Kindernothilfe (KNH), British Council, The Lutheran World Federation (LWF), Good Neighbors International, CARE Nepal, Captivating International, Save the Children, Plan International, World Food Program, FCDO/People in Need (PIN), USAID/John Hopkins Centre for Communication Programs, UNICEF Nepal as well as governmental organizations like the Center for Education and Human Resource Development (CEHRD) and Ministry of Federal Affairs and General Administration (MOFAGA).

ASN has strong foundations at the local level with marginalized people and their institutions including a child rights forum. It has shown its impact on rights holders and authorities in the areas of child rights, child protection, quality education and livelihood support. Aasaman Nepal (ASN) has been engaged in developing and implementing programs aimed at protection, promotion, and fulfillment of child rights in Nepal. The organization is working with nearly 84,771 children (42,154 boys and 42,617 girls) in 10 districts to mobilize community stakeholders and local resources on child labor and education issues. It is a participatory organization managed in a transparent, inclusive, and responsible manner at the local and national levels. It has a strong and inclusive team of dedicated professionals basically specialized in social mobilization and community development works. And whole team of Aasaman Nepal is continuously making effort to work at the community level to ensure that well-nourished children are being supported to go to school for getting an inclusive education in comprehensive safe and supportive school environment.

**2.2 Vision:** Aasaman envisages a society where all children are grown up in an enabling environment enjoying all their rights so as to achieve their full potential.

**2.3 Mission:** Aasaman facilitates a process in creating an enabling society that respects, protects, promotes, and fulfills the rights of children where all children equally enjoy all their basic rights.

**2.4 Goal:** Aasaman empowers marginalized communities and key stakeholders towards creating inclusive, responsible, and accountable governance mechanism to ensure rights of all children as enshrined in the legal and policy frameworks are respected, protected, promoted, and fulfilled.

## **2.5 Objectives**

- Increase access of rights holders, primarily the children and their family members, to government entitlements and service provisions including improving access to and quality of services in education, health, and social sectors
- Increase participation and representation of rights holders as meaningful decision makers at local institutions and government mechanisms in education, health, and local development.
- Strengthen capacity of rights holders and their associations/networks in claiming their rights at local to national levels
- Collaborate with and build capacity of state mechanisms to ensure delivery of quality services to the duty bearers.
- Build CSO capacity to strengthen networking, partnership and effective mobilizations towards protection, promotion, and fulfillment of human rights.
- Ensure better and rightful assistance is extended to the vulnerable, victims and survivors of disasters and other forms of humanitarian crisis with protection and support provisions as needed.
- Improve documentation and institutionalization of learning and good practices for policy advocacy, replication/scaling up and public awareness.

- All children should be enabled to attend formal day schools full-time.
- Every out of school child is a child laborer.

- There must be total abolition of child labor.
- Any justification perpetuating the existence of child labor must be condemned.

## Human Resource

ASN considers the employees/people as crucial organizational assets and is proud of the inclusive team of dedicated professionals holding expertise in their relevant sectors. There are 375 full-time staff (Female: 189 Male: 186; Dalit: 50; Janajati: 41; Muslim: 11; Disabled: 5) and 650+ volunteers supporting the various field level interventions. ASN holds extensive experience in prioritizing volunteers' development & ensures that the volunteers are professionally developed, socially empowered, and are provided with employment opportunities within the organization & beyond.

## Financial Capability, Commitments Internal Control System of the Organization

The internal procedure and control system is governed by the Aasaman Nepal's Financial and Administrative policy. The approving authority is segregated by the transaction threshold limits to the Program Manager, Project Coordinators, Executive Director, and the Chairman. We have clear cut job description for every staff and their role and responsibilities are designed so that there is proper segregation of duties and check, and balance is maintained within the organization.

Also, we have logistic and procurement policy which guides the assets management and supply chain management. Fixed assets register is maintained and acknowledgement from the staff is obtained for the asset's handover to them for use. Also, we do insurance for the office assets. The procurement process starts from the annual procurement which is prepared by joint coordination by the Program and finance team. A good request is made by the required person and is reviewed and approved. The bid invitation and comparative chart are analyzed, and the procurement committee made the recommendation for the possible bidder for agreement. The Decision of the Procurement committee is approved by the Executive director and the Chairman based on the threshold. Conflict of interest form are self-declared by all the members of procurement committee. The agreement with the vendor is made and the purchase order is issued as per the requirement which is approved by the Executive Director. Good, received note and stock register is maintained for the goods received and process for the payment is made via account payee cheque. All the payments are made via banking channel and only petty cash transactions are made petty cash. The maximum ceiling of petty cash is NPR 10000. We have a system of quarterly monitoring of projects and financial transactions. The reports are generated and shared with the senior management team for the improvements and suggestions. Also, we do projects audits and statutory audits so that regular compliance and standards are maintained as per the requirements.

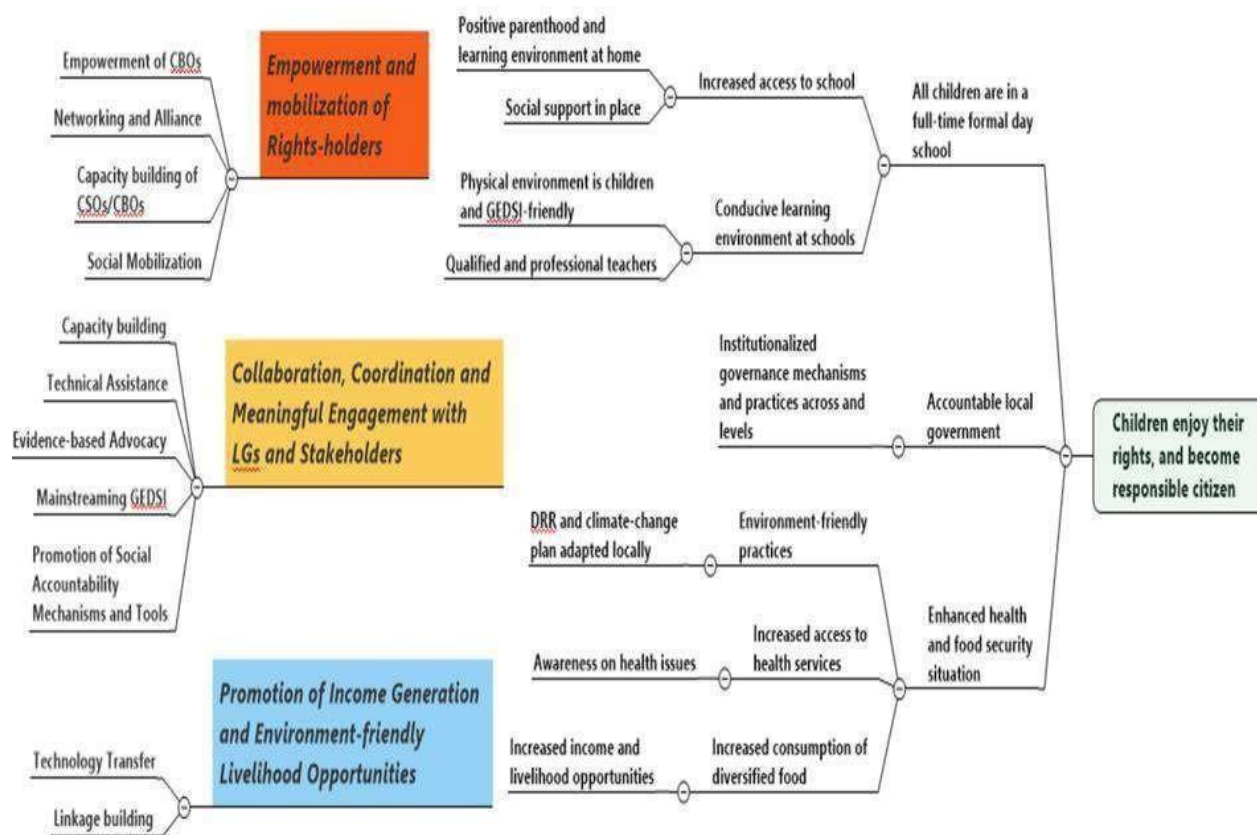

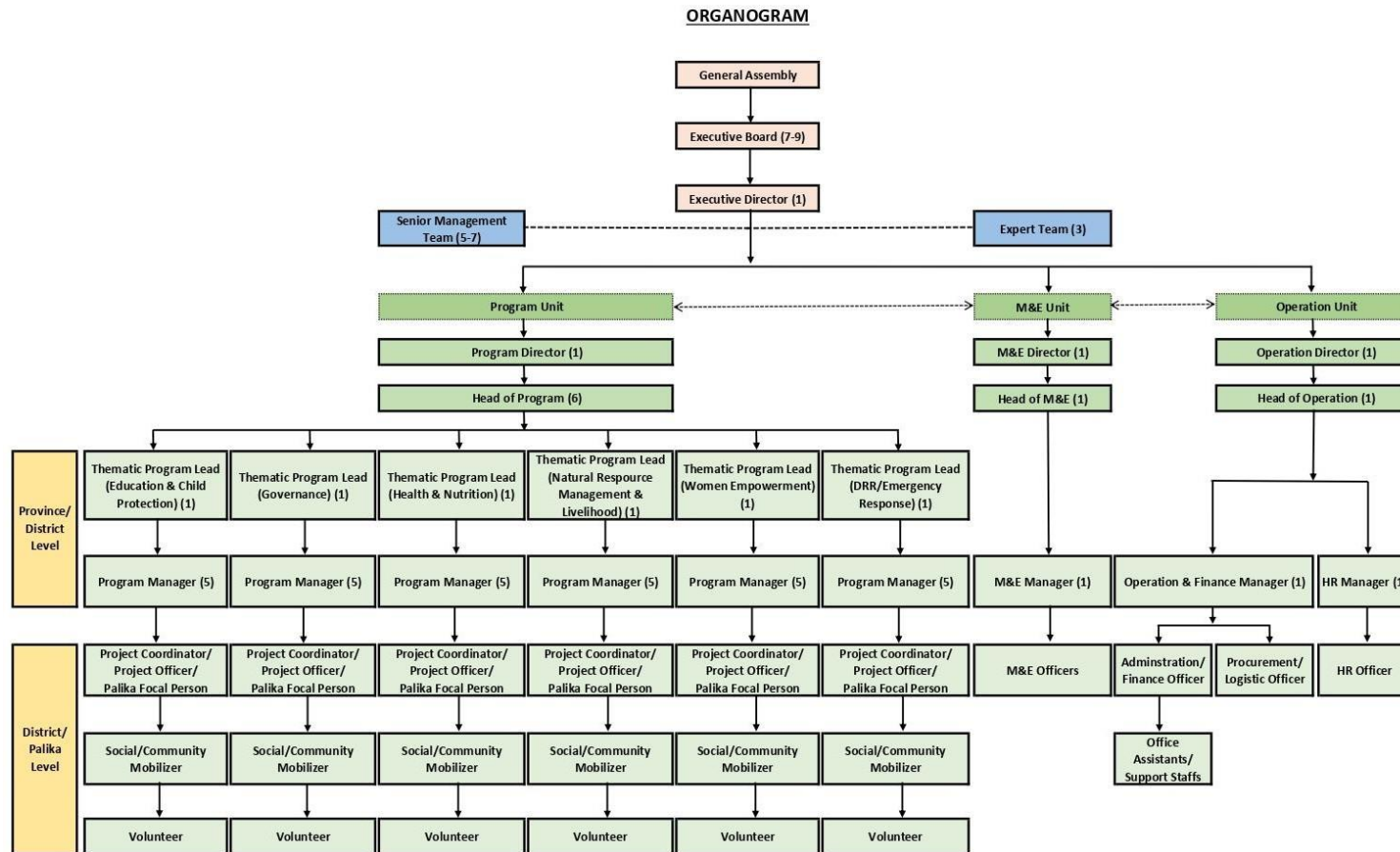
